M: Mom, I invited my friends to my birthday party next Saturday. Was that OK?

F: Sure, Tom, but they should leave here before 5:00. Your grandparents will come to see you. What time will you start the party?

M: I haven't decided yet. Ken can come between 1:30 and 2:30. John can arrive at 2:00. Steve will come just after his guitar lesson. It won't take him more than 30 minutes to our home.

F: What time will Steve's lesson finish?

M: He says 12:00. Oh, wait..., I've just got an e-mail from Ken. He will be here before 1:30.

F: Well, you should start the party when the last person arrives here.

M: You're right, Mom. I will.

F: Question: What time will Tom start the party?

(Pause: 8 sec.)

F: Number 2

M: Good morning, Nancy. I didn't see you in Ms. Green's English class yesterday. She gave us homework to do by Thursday.

F: What do we have to do, James?

M: We must write a report about our field trip last Friday.

F: Have you done it?

M: No. I wanted to ask her some questions about the homework, but I couldn't find her after school yesterday.

F: You know... she leaves school early every Tuesday.

M: Oh yeah, that's right! And she comes to school only Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, right? I should ask her today. Do you want to come with me?

F: Yes.

M: Question: When did Ms. Green give the homework in her English class?

(Pause: 8 sec.)

N: 2番。これから2つの対話が放送され、それぞれの対話の後に、質問が2つずつあります。質問に対する答えとして、最も適切なものをア~エの中から1つ選び、記号で答えなさい。対話と質問は1度だけ読まれます。解答時間はそれぞれ8秒です。これからAの対話を放送します。

(Pause: 1.5 sec.)

F: Bob, I lost my gloves!

M: Oh, Lisa. Can you remember everything that you did before you came to this bus stop?

F: Well, I was at a department store to buy a present for my father. I was looking for a coat, or a tie, or an art book. Coats were too expensive, and I couldn't choose a tie. So, I went down to the third floor to go to the bookstore, but I couldn't find a good art book. After that, I went back to the men's clothes shop to choose a tie. I asked a clerk to choose one for my father, and then, I bought it. I'm sure I was wearing the gloves then.

M: So, you didn't buy anything in the bookstore. And you were wearing your gloves when you got the present on the fourth floor. Am I right?

F: No. I actually bought a magazine for myself in the bookstore, and all the men's

M: Welcome to Kokusai Student Radio News. This is Kazuo. Today, Kaori is with us here. Kaori?

F: Hello, everyone. I'm here to ask Kokusai students to help me.

M: Oh, how can we help you?

F: In my social studies class, I'm writing a report about foreign visitors in Japan. I want more people to enjoy their stay. I need good ideas before I write my report.

M: OK. Can you tell us more about your report?

F: Sure. I read about trips from foreign countries to Japan in a magazine. I found the answers of one hundred foreign visitors to the question, "What did you enjoy the most in Japan?" Vets are animal doctors who save sick and injured animals, and they often give advice to people who have animals at home. Last week, I saw the news on TV about new technologies which would take people's jobs away. A scientist said that there were about 30 thousand jobs in the world today, and half of those jobs would disappear by 2040 because of new technologies. So, vets may disappear, too. I was worried, and I talked with my parents last night. My father said that new technologies made our life more convenient. He also said that computers or robots could do some jobs better than humans, and at the same time, they often made our jobs easier. Then, my mother said, "You have one thing that computers and robots don't have. Do you know what it is, Alan? Humans have a heart, but robots don't." She's right. We're better at some things than computers and robots. For example, animals can't talk, but I can imagine how they feel when they are sick. I can understand the feelings of people who are worried about their injured animals. With new technologies, vets may be able to save more animals than now.
