There are many steps that students can take in order to promote recycling in their schools and communities. These vary from simply raising awareness to more ambitiously creating volunteer programs and expanding recycling schemes.

Raising awareness of the problem is an important first step towards encouraging recycling and ensuring everyone does their bit. Students could give presentations in school assemblies emphasizing the need to recycle and the benefits of doing so. Additionally, they could distribute leaflets and display posters in classrooms, hallways and community centers. This could highlight the harmful effects of not recycling, such as destruction of habitat and pollution of the oceans and soil, and also help schools and their communities better understand how important recycling is and thus motivate more people to recycle.

Another way students could encourage recycling is by starting a local volunteering program where members of the community can clean beaches and areas of nature, collect recyclable materials and promote these drives on social media. Sharing the dire state of nearby areas would aid in convincing people to recycle rather than risk creating more pollution.

Students could also write to their local government and businesses suggesting ways to encourage recycling. An example is not to throw away single-use plastic bags by charging a fee for them at supermarkets and convenience stores. Another example is to bring old clothes to the stores for recycling. These schemes have been successfully employed in many countries and communities.
